



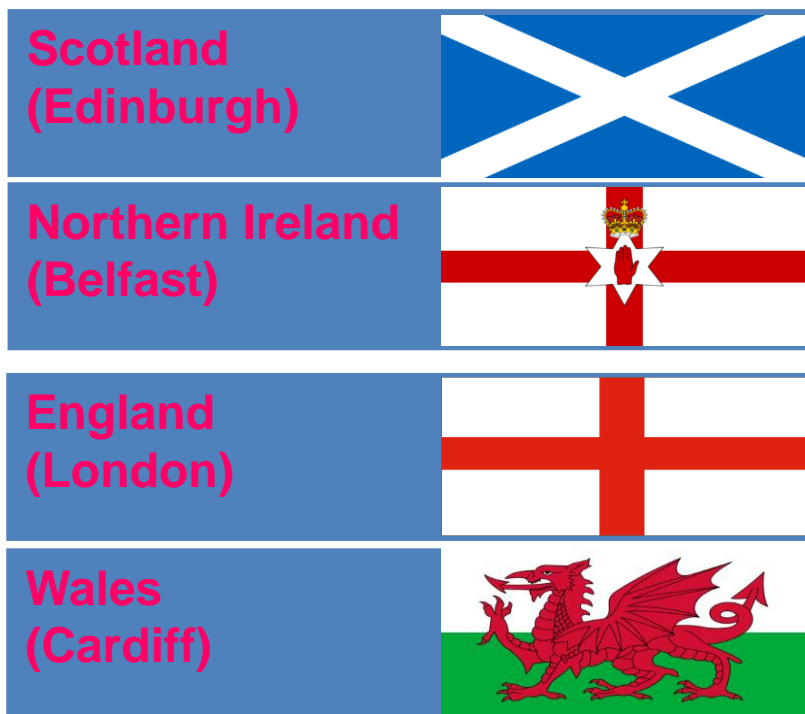

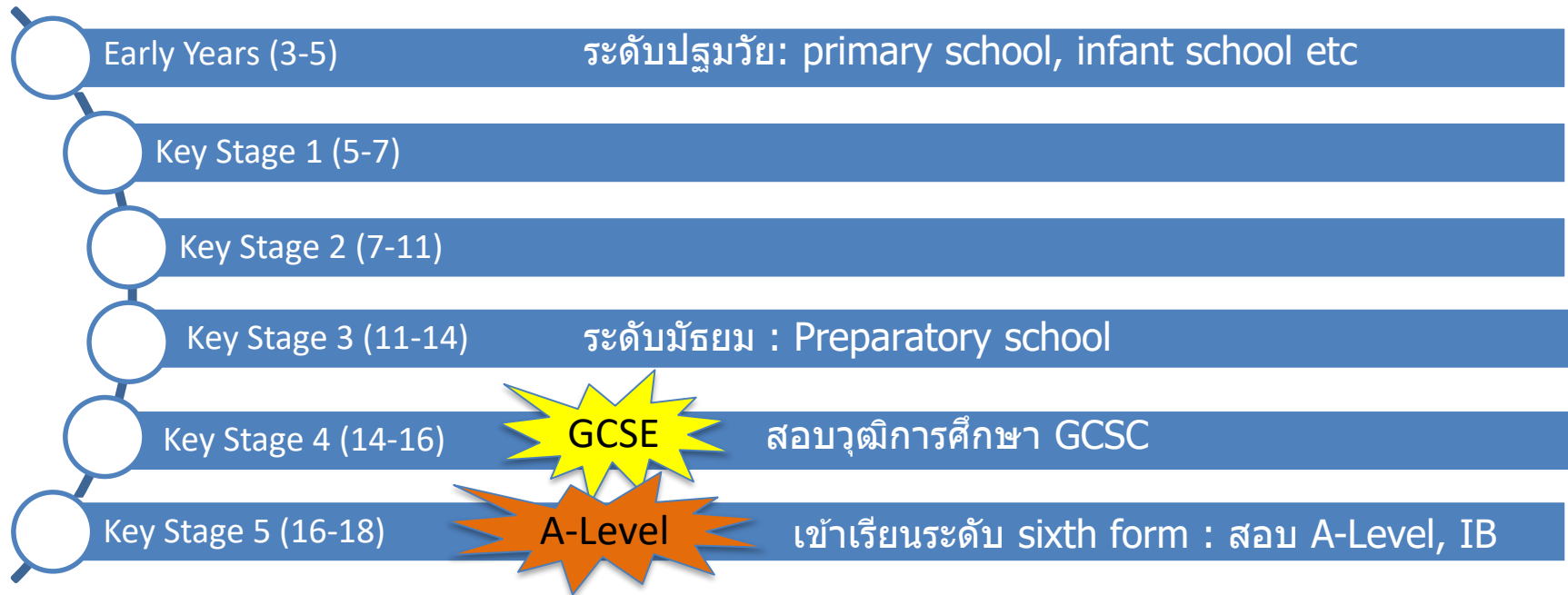

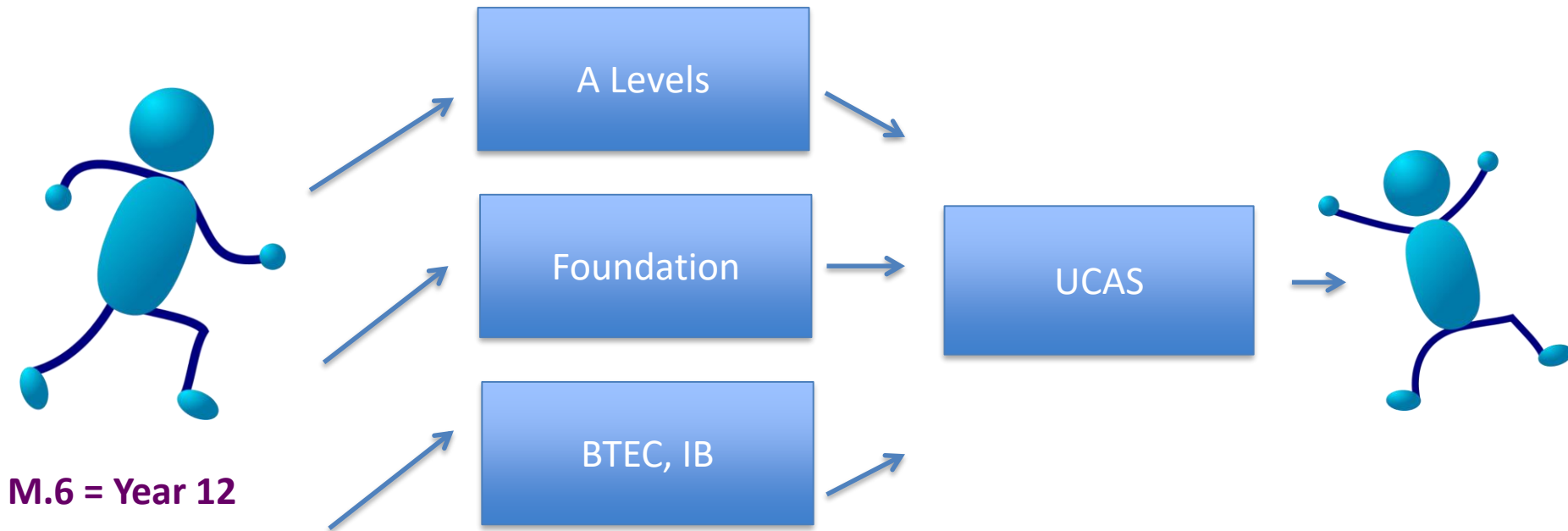

Teaching & Learning methods	Lectures, seminars, tutorials, supervised lab classes, etc.
Assessment	Final and continuing examination, continuous assessment, practical lab work, project work, written assignment or dissertation

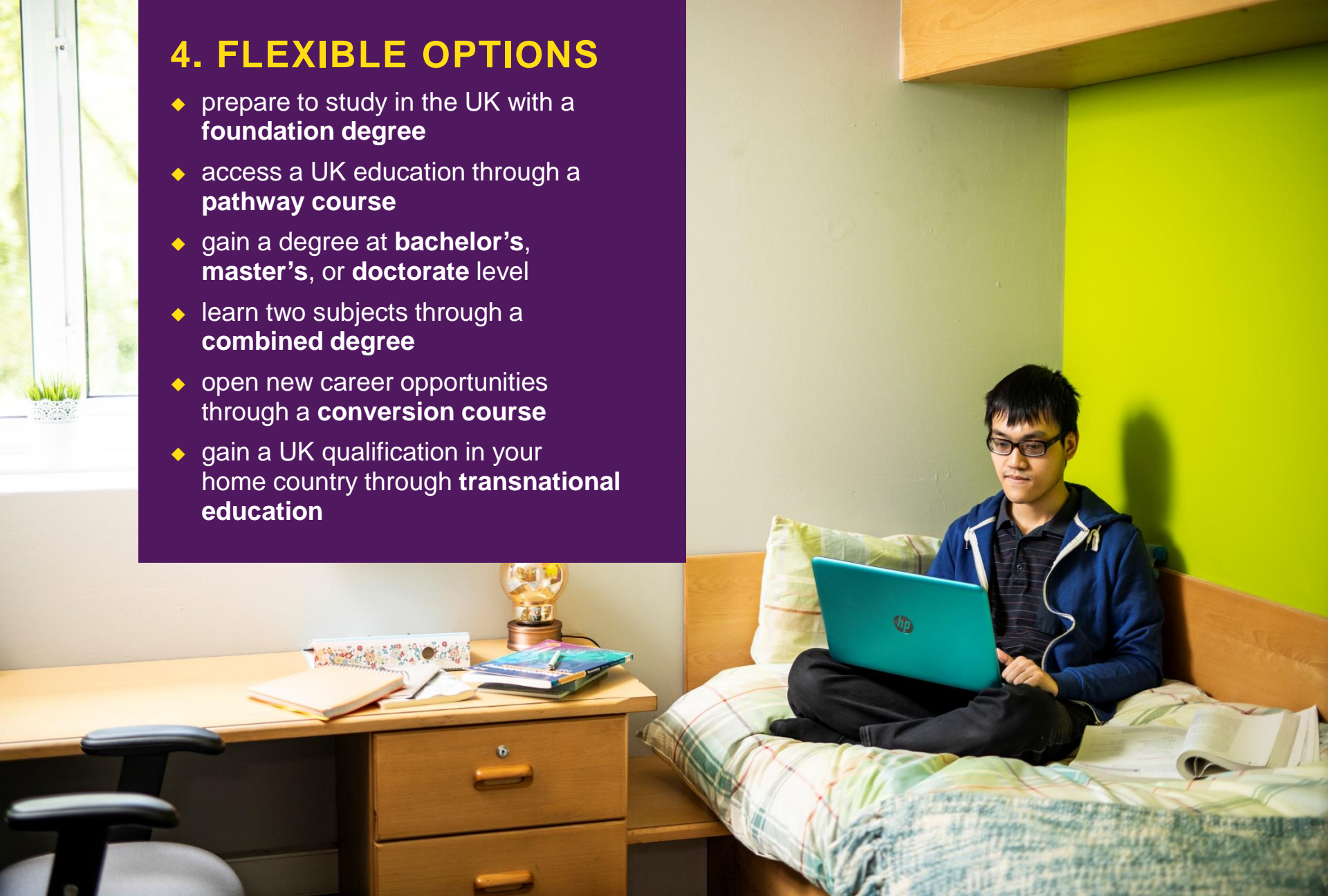

These are just some of the scholarships and bursaries we offer.

Students from England and the EU:

- **Attainment Scholarship (£1,200 - paid in two instalments in your first year of study)** for students who achieve 112 UCAS points from three A levels or equivalent (not including General Studies)*
- **Merit Scholarship (£2,000 - paid in two instalments in your first year of study)** for students who achieve 120 UCAS tariff points from three A levels or equivalent (not including General Studies)*
- **Studentship (£1,000)** for students with a household income of less than £25,000*

* Students living in Scotland, Wales or Northern Ireland are ineligible for the above awards. Students undertaking Foundation Years are ineligible for the Attainment and Merit Scholarships, but will be considered for the Studentship when progressing into what would ordinarily be Year One of their course. Students with previous experience of Higher Education are ineligible for the Studentship, but will be considered for the Attainment and Merit Scholarships.

- **Gillian Stead Maths Bursary (up to £6,300 paid in two instalments)** for maths students with 128 UCAS tariff points from three A levels or equivalent (excluding General Studies)

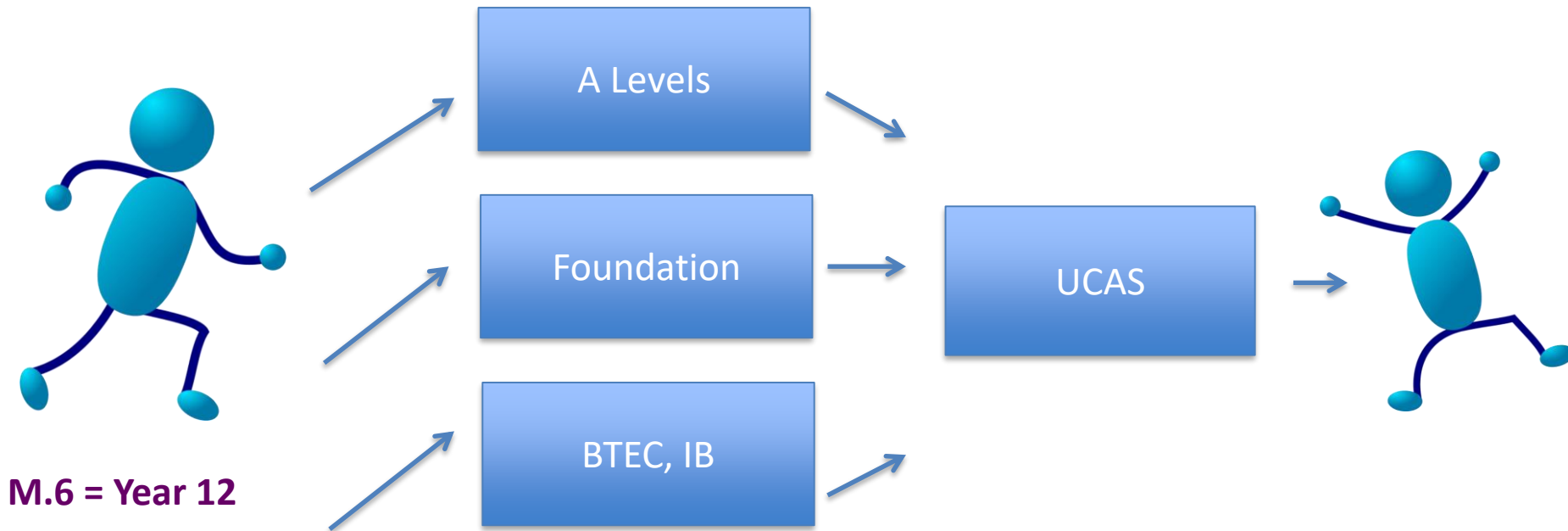

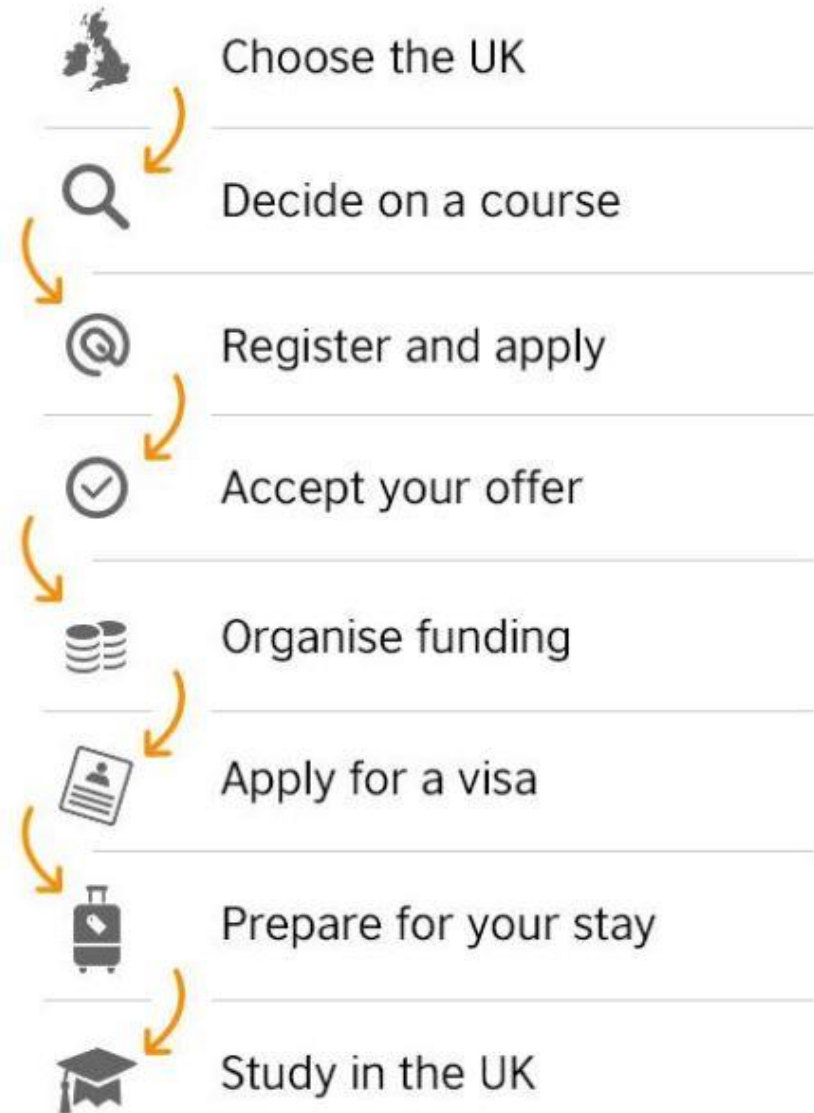

UCAS = Universities and Colleges Admissions Services

Apply online through www.ucas.com

Check qualifications needed in institutions' prospectus/website

Apply to up to **5 different universities/colleges** (up to 4 choices for medicine, dentistry and veterinary science/ medicine)

The fee is **£13** for a single choice or **£24** for multi courses and for late applications sent after 30 June.

Personal Statement

You will be required to provide a personal statement as part of your application to study at a university in the UK. This document is an opportunity for you to explain why you would like to study your chosen subject and what skills and experience you have that make you well suited to this field.

Top tips

- ◆ The course description on the university website will explain the qualities, skills and experience it requires. Be sure to mention how you match these in your personal statement.
- ◆ Talk about why you are applying for this course. Mention which aspects interest you in particular and how the course will support you with your future ambitions.
- ◆ As well as articulating why you are academically suited to this course, include any extra-curricular activities you are involved in and previous work experience, if you have any.

15 October

- Oxford, Cambridge
- Most courses in Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary Medicine

15 January

- Deadline for most undergraduate courses

March

- Deadline for some art and design courses

30 June

- Late deadline for most undergraduate courses

Graduate Route

Key information on the route

- ◆ The graduate immigration route will be open to international students who have completed a degree **at undergraduate level or above**.
- ◆ Successful applicants on this route will be able to stay and work, or look for work, in the UK for a maximum period of two years. Graduates **will also be able to switch into skilled work** once they have found a suitable job.
- ◆ The immigration route will be two years long and **would be a separate visa**, requiring a **new application** (including payment of a visa fee)
